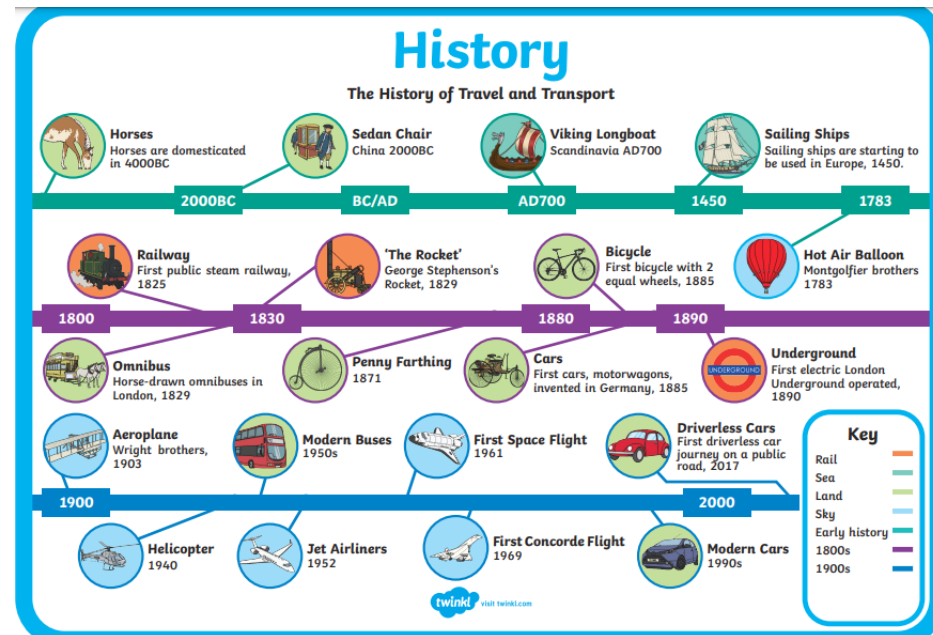


Key Vocabulary

Travel	Moving from one place to another.
Transport	Carrying people or goods from one place to another.
Petrol	Fuel used in many cars to make the motor run.
Electric transport	Uses electricity and has to be charged to make the motor run.
Wheels	Fixed below a vehicle to enable it to move easily over the ground.
Hinges	A movable joint or mechanism on which a door, gate, or lid swings as it opens and closes or which connects linked objects.
Map	A representation of an area of land or sea showing physical features
Directions	The way in which something moves. Including left, right, forwards, backwards
Bus	A large motor vehicle carrying passengers by road
