- Use of personal passwords and importance of keeping this safe

- Digi Duck puppet during circle time – links with PSHE
- Instructions to stay on certain programs during certain lessons
- Importance of sharing and supporting each other when using ICT
- Signing 8 rules of acceptable use
- Asking for adult support when stuck
- Introduction to the schools Learning Platform

Year 1

- Sharing worries with an adult
- Use of personal passwords and importance of keeping this safe
- Taught the Zip it..Block it..Flag it song and what it stands for
- Email – only emailing people you know, the dangers of opening unknown emails
- Re-signing and discussing the 8 rules of acceptable use
- Validity of websites – checking their content using multiple sources – not always reliable
- How to deal with pop ups
- Circle time discussions on using the internet at home safely
- New to Year 1 parent meeting – advice given
- Use of the internet as part of ICT lessons
- Use of ICT for playing games ie online maths resources.

Year 2

- Re-Signing and discussing 8 rules of acceptable use again at the appropriate level
- Always sharing concerns with adults
- Research unit – copy write, safety of internet use and validity of websites – not always reliable content so should check with a range of sources.
- E-mail – sending and receiving from unknown people, cyber bullying, sharing personal info
- Use of personal passwords and importance of keeping this safe and not sharing it with others
- How to deal with pop ups
- New to Year 2 parent meeting – advice given
